



Floor Plan





















Downtown District Amenities





With so many options for things to do in Tampa's Downtown, the challenge is not deciding where to go or what to do, it's deciding where to start. The downtown Tampa area is booming and so are the neighborhoods surrounding it. From family-friendly fun like the Aquarium, water sports and parks to exciting nightlife, events, bars and some of the best restaurants.

Named by Time's Money Magazine as one of the Five Best Big Cities in the United States, Tampa is considered a "Sunbelt beach city with international aspirations." Experience the inspiring culture of museums and diverse cuisines of memorable dining, unique shopping, and Downtown's array of arts and entertainment, outdoor activities, nightlife, and events.







By day, Tampa's downtown district bustles with business. By night, the city streets come alive as arts patrons trade in suits for evening wear. Downtown is home to many of Tampa's cultural gems. Take in world-class entertainment at the Tampa Bay Performing Arts Center. Sink into the plush chairs as the lights dim on an old movie classic at the Tampa Theater. View the ornate gingerbread Victorian towers at the University of Tampa as the women's crew team races down the Hillsborough River. Just down the waterway is another artistic jewel, the Tampa Museum of Art. Its collection of 20th century and contemporary art complements its Greek and Roman paintings collections.


Tampa is a major city in, and the county seat of, Hillsborough County, Florida, United States. It is on the west coast of Florida on Tampa Bay, near the Gulf of Mexico. Tampa is the largest city in the Tampa Bay Area. With an estimated population of 399,700 in 2019, Tampa is the 48th most-populous city in the U.S. and the third-largest city in Florida after Miami and Jacksonville. The bay's port is the largest in the state, near downtown's Channel District. Bayshore Boulevard runs along the bay, and is east of the historic Hyde Park neighborhood.

The Tampa mayor Pam Iorio made the redevelopment of Tampa's downtown, especially residential development, a priority. Several residential and mixed-development high-rises have been constructed. Another of Mayor Iorio's initiatives was the Tampa Riverwalk, a mixed-use path along the Hillsborough River in downtown. Channelside was recently approved to undergo major renovations by Tampa Bay Lightning owner Jeff Vinik along with Bill Gates and other investors. Several museums have already opened, including new homes for the Tampa Bay History Center, the Glazer Children's Museum, and the Tampa Museum of Art. The breakdown of development for the rest of the plan is as follows: 39% residential units, 29% office space, 15% hotels, 8% retail, 7% other, and 2% cultural uses. Mayor Bob Buckhorn continued these developments which are bearing fruit during the term of Mayor Jane Castor.

Finance, retail, healthcare, insurance, shipping by air and sea, national defense, professional sports, tourism, and real estate all play vital roles in the area's economy. Hillsborough County alone has an estimated 740,000 employees, a figure which is projected to increase to 922,000 by 2015. Several large corporations, such as banks and telecommunications companies, maintain regional offices in Tampa. Several Fortune 1000 companies are headquartered in the metropolitan area, including OSI Restaurant Partners, WellCare, TECO Energy, and Raymond James Financial. Other companies headquartered in Tampa include Greenway Health, Masonite International, Sykes Enterprises, Cott Corporation, Checkers
